IABS Newsletter

The IABS Newsletter is published three times a year, October, January, and April. Along with the IABS list servers (IABS-N and IABS-L), it is the primary communication tool of the membership. It is available at no cost to the members.

The IABS Newsletter carries letters from the president and incoming program chair, announcements of relevant board decisions (e.g. mini-conferences, meeting sites, etc.), calls for papers, conference announcements, notices of publications by members, member news (promotions, tenure, endowed chairs, awards, etc.), and guest editorials.

The deadline for submittal is usually the first Monday in the month of publication, although specific deadlines for each issue are announced over IABS-L and IABS-N three weeks ahead of the deadline.

Individuals can submit any information item they think might be of interest to the membership. Items should be submitted to the editor via e-mail or e-mail attachment if at all possible. The editor reserves the right to edit for length and sometimes for style (font, bullets, etc.). Usually, it is best to announce only the essentials in the newsletter and provide a URL or contact addresses for additional information.

The publication of the newsletter is announced over IABS-L and IABS-N. The newsletter is distributed via the IABS web page (<http://www.iabs.net>), although paper copies can be mailed via regular post if a request and address information is sent to the editor.

Past issues of all newsletters published since 1995 can be viewed on the IABS web page. You need Adobe Acrobat Reader to download the newsletter.
