

IABS DOCTORAL CONSORTIUM 2024 35th Annual Conference Annapolis (MD), United States

Doctoral consortium dates: June 12 & 13 Main Conference dates: June 13 - 16

The IABS Doctoral Consortium, held every year as part of the pre-conference activities, offers doctoral students the possibility to connect, discuss, and receive sound advice on their research projects, dissertation plans, and teaching skills. Some of our previous participants have described it as a platform where ambitious research at the crossroads of Business and Society is shared and discussed among peers.

This year, participants will benefit from several opportunities including presentations on topics such as theory building, academic publishing (manuscript development, theoretical contributions, publication strategies), working on your dissertation, developing an academic pipeline, teaching, and opportunities to meet and discuss with editors of top journals in the field. Each participant will benefit from engaging in discussions with senior IABS members.

Consortium Schedule:

- The Doctoral Consortium takes place at the conference venue, on June 12th (full day) and Thursday, June 13th (half-day). It finishes after each participant meets with their mentors during lunch to discuss their research project or dissertation plans. We will pair up each participant with a mentor.
- Please reserve time for dinner on the evening of Wednesday, June 12th, designed for networking with PhD students and IABS senior members. The dinner is hosted by the IABS board.

Eligibility:

- Current doctoral students (regardless of stage in the program)
- Attending the doctoral consortium does not involve any cost, but registration for the main conference is required for accepted participants. Note that the consortium will be conducted entirely in person (remote participation is not possible).

Application Process:

- Admission to the doctoral consortium is subject to limited availability.
- Interested applicants should submit an extended abstract of up to 3 pages (excluding cover page and references) detailing the research project you wish to discuss with your senior mentor. This will facilitate pairing with an IABS senior member who shares your research interests and expertise.
- Please add to your submission a cover page, including your information: name, university affiliation, year of your Ph.D. program, research topic (if determined), a brief statement of your dissertation's primary goal, and three to five relevant keywords. The remainder of the document should describe the project. Please include a list of references.
